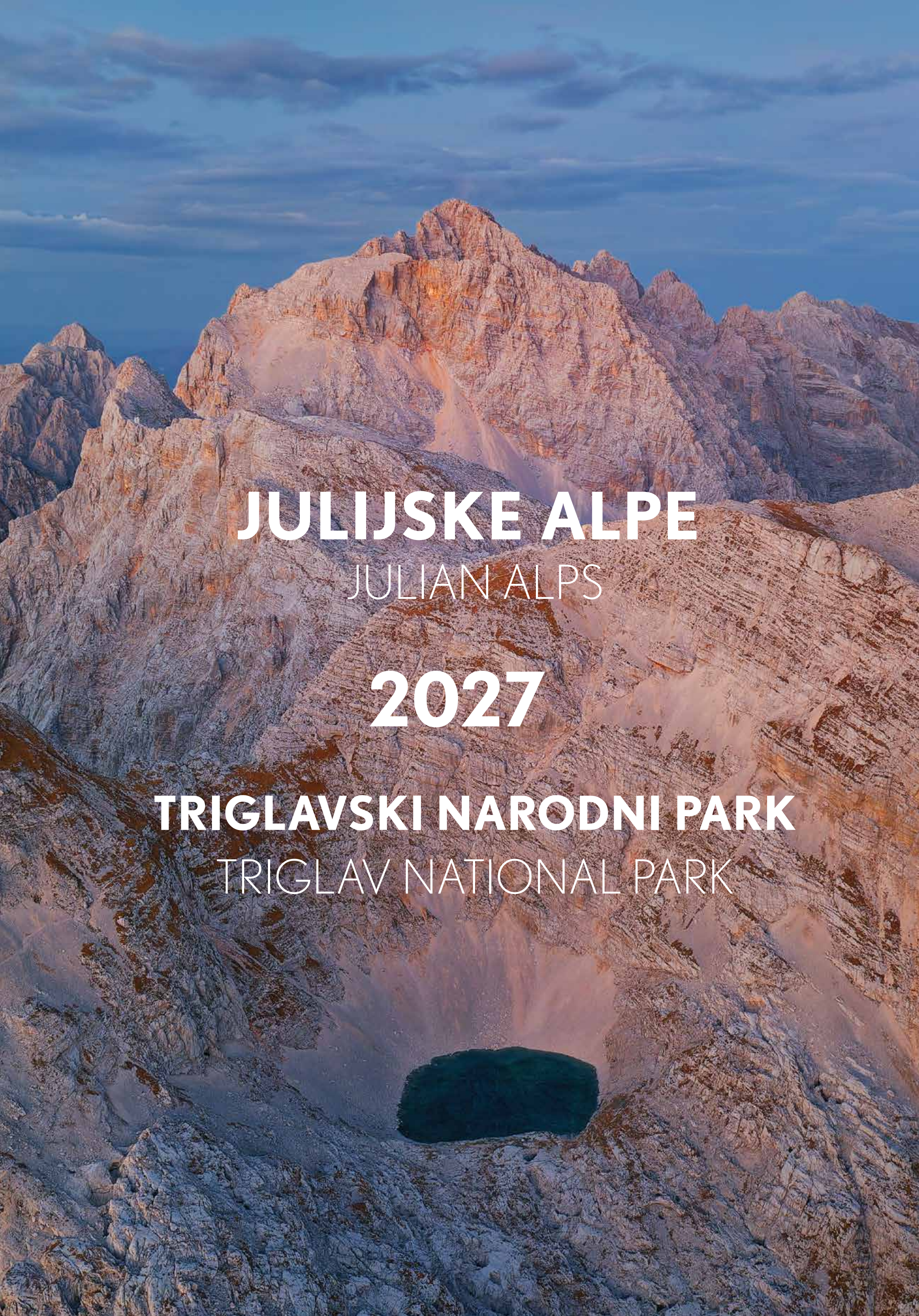

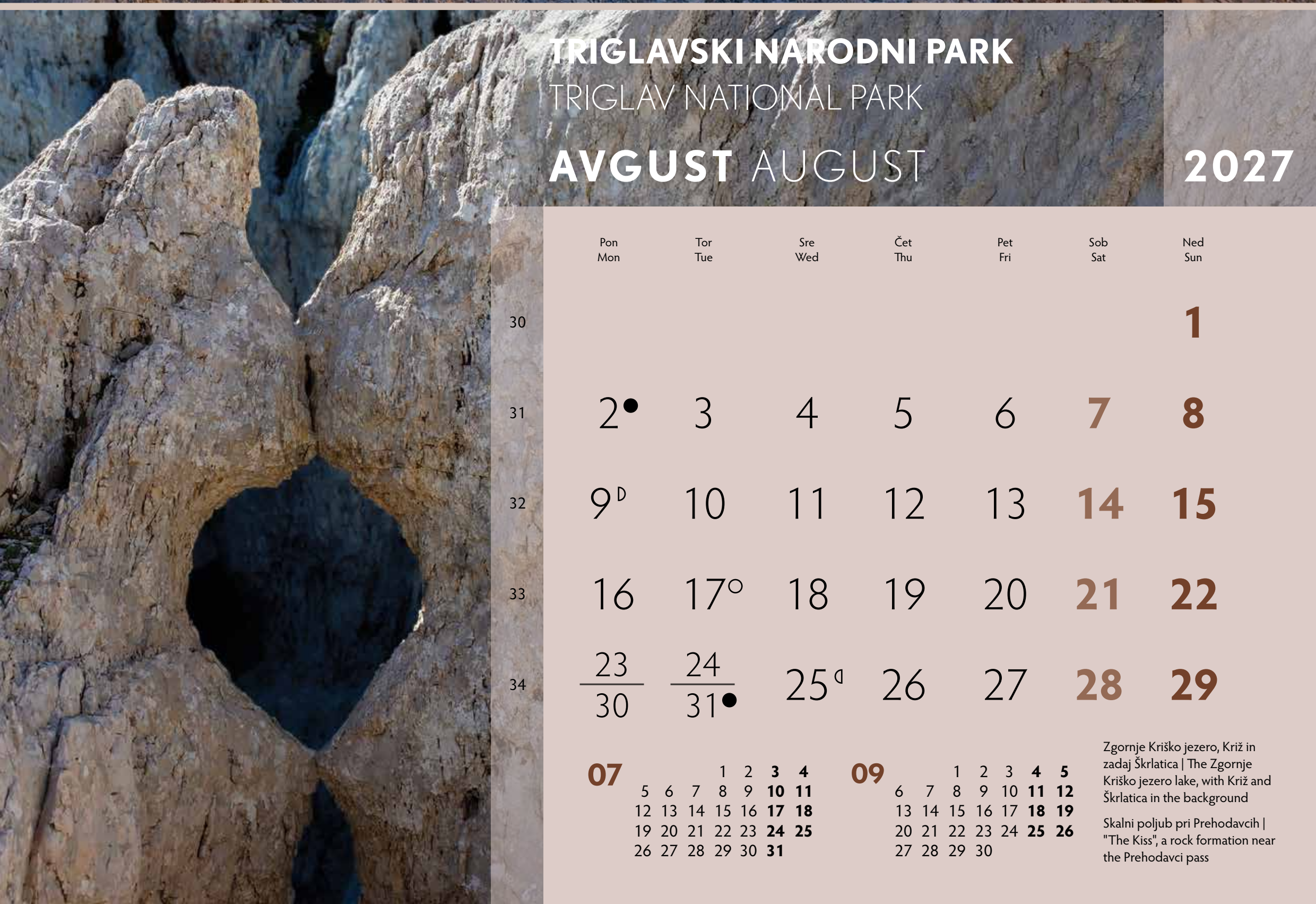

Triglavski narodni park

Triglavski narodni park (TNP) je na začetku dvajsetega stoletja, sprva kot ideja, nato kot institucija za varstvo narave, vstopil v pestro zgodovino Vzhodnih Julijskih Alp. Spada med najstarejše parke v Alpah in je eden največjih naravnih zakladov Slovenije. Letnice, ki so zaznamovale TNP: prvi predlog za zavarovanje v letu 1906, »Alpski varstveni park« v dolini Triglavskih jezer leta 1924 (1600 ha), odlok o razglasitvi Doline Triglavskih jezer za »Triglavski narodni park« leta 1961 (2000 ha) in Zakon o Triglavskem narodnem parku (83.807 ha) v letu 1981.

Leži v Julijskih Alpah blizu tromeje med Avstrijo, Italijo in Slovenijo. Najvišja točka je vrh Triglava (2864 m), po katerem je park dobil ime, najnižja pa je v Tolminskih koritih (180 m).

Pokrajinske značilnosti so ledeniške alpske doline, gorske planote in visokogorje nad zgornjo gozdno mejo. Posebnosti TNP so kristalno čiste vode, globoke soteske, ostanki pragozdov, izjemno bogata biotska pestrost, eldorado planinskega cvetja, med njimi nekaj endemitov (zoisova zvončica, julijski mak, srebrna krvomočnica). Značilne živali v parku so gams, kozorog, jelen, medved, ris, orel in številne druge vrste ptic, plazilci in endemična postrv. Skratka, več kot 5500 različnih živih bitij je našlo svoj prostor na območju TNP.

V tem prostoru sta kmetijstvo in varstvo narave zaveznika, ki ohranjata življenjski prostor rastlin in živali ter tako tudi naravne vire za življenje človeka samega. Obdelana polja, njive, travniki, senožeti in pašniki, dolinska naselja in pašne planine, značilne hiše in številni majhni seniki, hlevi in stanovi ustvarjajo kulturno krajino. Kulturna dediščina je prepoznavna po svoji raznolikosti, saj je mogoče preprosto prepoznati in razlikovati tipično bohinjsko hišo od tiste v Zgornjesavski dolini in Posočju.

Julijske Alpe

Julijske Alpe so lani v Maroku od Unesca dobile zveneči naslov Čezmejno biosferno območje Julijske Alpe, katerega jedri sta Triglavski narodni park na slovenski strani, na italijanski pa Naravni park Julijsko predgorje.

V počastitev te čezmejne potrditve, da narava in njeno varovanje ne poznata meja, je Dan Briški za obsežno, osupljivo razstavo Julijske Alpe iz svojega obsežnega opusa izbral fotografije, ki jih poizkušajo ujeti in prikazati kot enotno gorsko skupino.

Istoimenska razstava v Informacijsko izobraževalnem središču Dom Trenta vabi k občudovanju in spoznavanju ter prepoznavanju resničnega bogastva, ki nima cene ter nas opominja na našo odgovornost do skupne gorske dediščine.

Dan Briški

Fotograf gorske narave

Dan Briški (rojen 1985 v Postojni) s fotografijo intenzivno živi zadnjih 20 let. Kar se je začelo kot osnovnošolska radovednost, je preraslo v profesionalno pot samozaposlenega fotografa, ki danes pokriva širok nabor zvrsti – od arhitekturne in produktne do portretne fotografije. Svoje znanje predaja naprej kot vodja fotografskih ekspedicij in delavnic po Sloveniji in sosednjih državah. Njegova prava strast pa ostaja zapisana tam, kjer se končajo poti – v odmaknjenem svetu Julijskih Alp in Trente.

V gore je najprej zahajal kot pohodnik in plezalec. Danes kot vodnik Planinske zveze Slovenije in član Alpinističnega odseka Ljubljana-Matica združuje vrhunsko poznavanje terena z umetniškim očesom. Njegov pristop je brezkompromisen: pogosto se v gore odpravi ponoči, v mrazu in tišini, da bi ujel prvo jutranjo svetlobo ali dramatične barve ob koncu dneva, ko narava resnično oživi.

Natovorjen s težko opremo, stojali in objektivih, Dan išče motive za svojo dušo v vseh vremenskih razmerah. Naj bo to sonce, dež, neizproslen veter ali sneg – v vsakem razpoloženju narave vidi priložnost za vizualno melodijo. Njegove fotografije so prepričljive in tenkočutne; ob njih lahko gledalec skoraj začuti gorski hlad in se za trenutek preseli v divjino, ki je marsikomu nedostopna.

Svoja dela redno objavlja v osrednjih revijah, kot sta Planinski vestnik in Lovec, ter v knjižnih izdajah (npr. Slovenske gore: v objektivu letnih časov, 2014) in koledarjih Triglavskega narodnega parka. Za svoje delo je prejel več priznanj in nagrad. Doslej se je predstavil na številnih skupinskih ter devetih samostojnih razstavah doma in v tujini.

Triglav National Park

First as an idea and then as a nature conservation institution, Triglav National Park (TNP) entered the history of the Eastern Julian Alps at the beginning of the 20th century. It is among the earliest parks to have been established in the Alps and one of the greatest natural treasures of Slovenia. The highlights of its history include the following: in 1906, the first protection proposal was launched; in 1924 an »Alpine Protection Park« (1,600 ha) was established in the Triglav Lakes Valley; 1961 marks the decree promulgating Triglav Lakes Valley as the Triglav National Park (2,000 ha) and in 1981 the Triglav National Park Act (83,807 ha) was passed.

TNP's most prominent landscape features include glacier-shaped valleys, mountain plateaus and high-altitude mountains above the tree line. The park prides itself on pure waters, deep-cut gorges, remains of virgin forests, richness of biodiversity, and an eldorado of mountain flowers including a number of endemic plants such as Zois' Bellflower (*Campanula zoysii*), Julian Poppy (*Papaver alpinum* subsp. *ernesti-mayeri*) and Silver-leaved Cranesbill (*Geranium argentum*). Typical park animals are the chamois, ibex, red deer, brown bear, lynx, eagle, numerous bird and reptile species, and the endemic marble trout. In short, TNP is home to over 5,500 plant and animal species.

In this area agriculture and nature conservation walk hand in hand, preserving the habitat for plant and animal species and natural resources needed for the survival of man. Cultivated fields, meadows, hay meadows and pasturelands, valley settlements and alps, typical houses and abundant small hayracks, sheds and homesteads make up the cultural landscape of Triglav National Park, the most striking feature of which is its diversity as the typical Bohinj house can be easily recognized and contrasted against a house in the Upper Sava Valley (Zgornjesavska dolina) or the Soča Valley.

We hope that the paths you take in Triglav National Park will leave you with lasting memories and encourage you to come back again, for another story, just as exciting and unique as this one.

Please leave your vehicle in one of the many designated car parks.

Stay on the trails. Keep your noise level down and avoid disturbing the animals.

Respect the habitats of plants and animals. Admire them, but make sure your presence does not disturb their lives, as unique and magical as yours.

Enjoy clear starry nights from a bench outside the mountain huts and lodges, shelters and bivouacs. Camping or bivouacking outside designated areas is not permitted.

.....

Be considerate visitors who take nothing except for memories and data stored on memory sticks, and leave nothing but footprints.

Julian Alps

Last year in Morocco, UNESCO awarded the Julian Alps the distinguished title of the Julian Alps Transboundary Biosphere Reserve. Its core areas are Triglav National Park on the Slovenian side and the Julian Prealps Natural Park in Italy.

To celebrate this cross-border recognition—that nature and its protection know no boundaries—Dan Briški selected photographs from his extensive body of work for this remarkable exhibition, aiming to capture and present the Julian Alps as a unified mountain range.

The exhibition invites visitors to admire, explore, and truly recognize a priceless natural wealth, while reminding us of our responsibility toward our shared mountain heritage.

Dan Briški

A Photographer of Mountain Nature

Dan Briški (born 1985 in Postojna) has been living and breathing photography for the past twenty years. What began as a curiosity in primary school grew into a professional career. As a freelance photographer, Dan Briški covers a wide range of genres, from architectural and product photography to portraits. He shares his knowledge as the leader of photo tours and workshops across Slovenia and neighboring countries. Yet his true passion lies where the trails end – in the untouched wilderness of the Julian Alps and the Trenta valley.

Dan first approached the mountains as a hiker and climber. Today, as a certified mountain guide with the Alpine Association of Slovenia and a member of the Ljubljana-Matica Alpine Club, he combines intimate knowledge of the terrain with a finely tuned artistic eye. His approach is uncompromising: he often sets out into the mountains at night, in the cold and darkness, to capture the first morning light or the dramatic colors of evening, when nature comes alive.

Carrying heavy camera equipment, tripods, and lenses, Dan seeks motifs that speak to the soul in every kind of weather. Sunshine, rain, biting wind, or snow – for him, every mood of nature is an opportunity to create a visual melody. His photographs are both compelling and sensitive; they allow viewers to feel the crisp mountain air and, for a moment, step into wilderness that remains out of reach to many.

He regularly publishes his work in magazines such as *Planinski vestnik* (Alpine Journal) and *Lovec* (Hunter), books – e.g., *Slovenske gore: v objektivu letnih časov* (*Slovenia's Mountains: In the Embrace of the Seasons*, 2014) – and in calendars for Triglav National Park. His work has earned numerous awards and recognitions, and he has participated in many group exhibitions as well as nine solo exhibitions both in Slovenia and abroad.
